Sunway A-level students achieve 100% passes

All 125 A-level students of Sunway College did their lecturers proud when they achieved 100% passes in the Cambridge Board's June 2001 examinations.

Close to 60% of them obtained at least one A with the top 10% scoring 4 As. The 13 top students are Ang Meng Hui, Carolyn Au Fay Yin, David Chiang Chun Fai, Christine Tan Su Ying, Lim Meng Yoong, Liu Jiu Hui, Mark Hoo Chi Kiat, Nicholas Lee Cheng Ooi, Serena Wee Li Fern, Shaun Lee Ling Choon, Soon Suyin and twin brothers Wong Jay Ron and Wong Jay Wyn.

Not surprisingly, some of them have already been offered places in reputable universities overseas.

Soon Suyin who obtained four straight As will join Cambridge University where she will pursue a degree in Engineering. Soon who is currently studying Engineering in Singapore, received an unconditional entry from Cambridge.

Joining her in Cambridge is coursemate Karen Hooi who also scored straight As in the November 2000 examination. Hooi will be studying Economics.

Another top scorer, Jocelynn Liu, will read Law at Oxford University.

JPA scholar, Syamsul Hani Hasran, was another high achiever. He has already left to pursue his studies in Computer Science at the University of Southern California in the US.

Twins Wong Jay Ron and Jay Wyn were happy with their four As. The brothers who play water polo for the country were training for the XXI SEA Games when they received their results.

Asked how he and his brother managed to do so well despite their hectic training schedule, Jay Wyn said consistency in terms of tackling studies is important.

"One should focus on goals and have a well balanced life," added the younger of the twin, Jay Ron.
