❑ FIVE Sunway College students, who enrolled in the Victoria University of Technology twinning degree programme in business, scored top marks in their recent exams to beat not only their Sunway peers but also their counterparts in VicUni's Australian campuses.

Kristina Hoe, an Indonesian student, scored the highest marks in business law and microeconomic principles while Sylvania Martinus topped the university in business statistics, Tee Ching Chee in statistics for business and marketing, Chin

Yu Huey in managerial economics and Terence Chai Shau Min in financial accounting. Overall, Sunway students posted a pass average of 86.2 per cent for business law (semester 2) compared to 68.3 per cent at VicUni's Footscray campus and 80 per cent at the Werribee campus. The Sunway pass rate for business statistics (semester 1) was 96 per cent, well above the rate of 76 per cent achieved in Australia.
