# Sunway hospitality students open cafe

SUNWAY College's School of Hospitality and Tourism Management recently opened their own cafe — Bonjour Deli, wanting to add a French flavour to the "Meetings, events and conventions" module of their events management skills course.

A team of 23 students spearheaded the month long preparation while being continuously assessed especially in the aspects of pre-event organisation, portraying team effort and management skills.

College principal Elizabeth Lee literally "broke the ice" to mark the launch by opening up an ice sculpture to reveal a plaque inscribed with the deli's name to commemorate the launch.

In her speech, Lee expressed her gratitude for the commitment and support from members of the industry for helping in the setting up of the deli.

The cafe offer students the opportunity and experience on how to run a small-scale business. Students can also acquire knowledge in business operations through elective modules

in the later part of the diploma programme.

Bonjour Deli is open on Wednesdays and Fridays, and operates on a volunteer basis.

Meanwhile, five Sunway students were awarded the Malaysian Prize for emerging tops in the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) examinations.

The students were Jimmy Chan Kwei Yin who scored 92% to emerge as the top student for Paper 2: Legal Framework while Lim Saw Fan and Tan Lin Wan scored 87% each for Paper 3: Management Information. Their classmates Sak Mei Lin and Ruzlena Ahmad scored 78% and 70% in Paper 7: Tax Framework and Paper 10: Accounting and Audit Framework.

In addition to this, Sunway students were also recognised for their impressive performance in the December 1999 examination. The ACCA pass rates for Module F of the examination was 77% for the college, while the world average was 49%.
