

World-class results at Sunway College

SUNWAY College has earned a reputation as a leading institution offering professional courses with its students scoring world-class results.

Among the many courses offered by Sunway is the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants programme.

The college produced yet another top student when Yee Mei Hui won the World Prize for ACCA Paper 1 (Accounting Framework) in the July 1998 examinations.

Yee, who scored 93 marks, beat students from the United Kingdom, Singapore, Hong Kong, India and many other countries.

Two other Sunway College students — Tamarai S. Muthusamy and Hiew Pau Yee — also did the college proud when they scored 92 and 90 marks respectively in the same paper.

For Foundation Stage, Paper I (Accounting Framework), Sunway College achieved a pass rate of 85 per cent compared with the world's overall rate of 51 per cent.

The college also scored significantly higher pass rates for Paper 2 (Legal Framework) with 55 per cent compared with world overall rate of 39 per cent) and Management Informa-

tion, Paper 3 (Sunway 63 per cent, world 43 per cent).

Yee, 18, attributed her success to the support from her parents, family and lecturers.

"You must be willing to make certain sacrifices and allocate your time properly when you undertake the ACCA programme. Work hard, be dedicated and never give up," Yee, a former student of Sekolah Menengah Seaport, Petaling Jaya, said.

She said her classmates have also done exceptionally well with many scoring 80 per cent or higher.

Prior to this, two other

Sunway College students Joachim Ang Cheng Poe and Cheah Sek Hon received Malaysian Prize awards for their outstanding results in the June 1998 examination.

Ang was awarded the Malaysian Prize for ACCA Paper 4 (Organisational Framework) while his classmate Cheah won the award for Paper 12 (Management and Strategy).

Sunway College students, Yong Chee Keong and Janice Chin who sat for the December 1997 and June 1998 examinations respectively, also won World Prize awards for ACCA Pa-

per 4 (Organisational Framework).

Chin was at Sunway College recently with two former students and three top achievers in the ACCA programme to give a talk to present students on the secrets of examination strategy.

The ACCA is recognised by the Malaysian Institute of Accountants. MIA started conducting its own examination in collaboration with ACCA in 1995.

Intake for the ACCA course is now in progress. The entry qualification is two GCE A-level passes and three O-level credits, including English.

In addition to the ACCA, Sunway College also offers the Certified Accounting Technician (CAT) course which is a vocational qualification designed to support the work of professional accountants.

The CAT course is designed to test the knowledge, skills and understanding of a student to work in accounting support roles. The next intake for CAT is in July.

Upon the successful completion of the CAT course, students can proceed to do the ACCA course where they will skip the foundation level and enter straight into the certificate stage.
