

Success is sweet

THE gruelling hours they spent studying have paid off for students of Sunway College's-Australian twinning degree programme. With an outstanding pass rate of 96 per cent, many had done well with quite a number chalking up straight As.

The Sunway-Monash University twinning programme saw more than 40 per cent of the candidates getting at least five distinctions (from a total of eight subjects) with six students scoring a perfect score of 8As.

They were Yuen Chui Yen, Soh Yin Chi, Low Ken Foong, Chai Yee Wen, Ng Sook Wah and Thian Sze Mei. Another four obtained 7As.

Students sitting the Sunway-University of Western Australia also did well, with Thong Mun Wai taking the lead with 7As.

Yeo Sey Ley got 6As while his mates Byron Paul, Liew Yin Fui and Seow Yet Fun each obtained 5As.

For the Sunway-Flinders University of South Australia programme, honours

went to Foo Ming Fwee and Kuan Bih Fang, who both scored 5As (out of six subjects) and another four students obtaining 4As.

Sunway-Victory University of Technology similarly reaped golden rewards when two of its students, Ting Mee Ling and Hung Poh Ling, obtained a perfect score of 8As. Another

seven got 7As.

So, what do the fruits of success mean to these students? One thing is for sure.

Those with outstanding results will be awarded the Dato Dr Jeffrey Cheah Scholastic Award which carries a RM4,000 endowment given to the best student for each programme.
