

Sunway's impressive record

A SENIOR Education officer from Australia's Secondary Education Authority (SEA) was impressed with the performance of Sunway College students during his recent visit here.

David Wood, who was here to assess the College's grading and assessment procedures for its Western Australian Matriculation (WAM) programme said the consistently high standards were

due to the stringent standards set by the college and its lecturers.

"The commendable graduation rate of not less than 85 per cent for the past five years bears testimony to these high standards," said Wood.

Wood also said that some of the Sunway students even performed better than their Australian counterparts in subjects like economics, ap-

plied mathematics and human biology.

Sunway WAM programme head, Sukanya Siva, said the course required students to develop high level of thinking, problem solving and application skills.

She added that with WAM qualifications, students were also eligible to enrol in universities in the USA and Britain.
