Top honour for Malaysian

KATHLEEN Sim, a former Sunway College student, was named Western Michigan University's (WMU) 1995 *Presidential Scholar*.

The award is the highest honour presented by WMU to senior students.

The certificate was presented by WMU president Diether H. Haenicke at the 15th annual presidential scholars convocation in the United States.
