

☐ Sunway College has been lauded for being the first educational institution in the country to organise a crime prevention campaign.

"This is the first time an educational institution has taken the initiative to organise a crime prevention campaign," said Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF) vice-president Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye.

Sunway College deputy chairman Tan Sri Dr Ramon Navaratnam said it is important to protect oneself against crime whether at home, out on the street or at the shopping mall. "Crime prevention is a collective responsibility and what is unsafe for my neighbour, will definitely be unsafe for me."

The campaign was jointly organised by Sunway College, Bandar Sunway

Safe City Initiative, Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation and Primal Ace Enterprise. Monash University Malaysia was the main sponsor for the event.

A special demonstration by the Police Dog Unit was the highlight of

the launch.

Guests were also shown some nifty self-defence moves by Sunway Shito-Ryu Karate Club members, and attended a workshop on Crime Prevention and Fire Safety.

A series of workshops on crime and

fire prevention and safety measures were held for three consecutive days for staff and members of the public.

"The ultimate aim of the campaign is to make Bandar Sunway a crime-free township," said Navaratnam.
