

Sunway students score top marks

KHOO Yu Wen, Lee Chia Ying, Leong Wei-Xiang and Yap Yi Shin are Australian Matriculation Programme (AUSMAT) students from Sunway College who have obtained distinctions in the 2014 Business Educators of Western Australia (BEWA) Accounting competition.

In addition, Yi Shin was placed second highest in the world ranking.

The competition is designed to help AUSMAT students prepare for their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) examination.

WACE is equivalent to Australian Year 12, a pre-university level. The results from the competition help students in their revision for the final exam by highlighting areas that need more attention and improvement.

Both Yu Wen and Wei-Xiang said that their helpful AUSMAT lecturers, in particular Jason Soh Chiaw Ker, and Sunway College's facilities contributed towards their success.

The students don't practise last-minute

revision. Instead, they believe in constantly revising what they have learnt.

"The AUSMAT programme really encourages in-depth learning," said Yu Wen.

"For our Accounting subject, besides textbook learning, we went on a field trip to Bank Negara where we visited the coin museum and got to learn more about currency.

"Participation in the I-care day fundraiser allowed us to learn sales and its relation to accounting, where knowledge of cost, profit and volume are applied," she added.
